Year 10 Graphics Summer Assessment Plan 2025

a. Summer Assessment Requirements

Rationale:

The content links directly with the current SoW/Project on students' individual coursework themes and builds on student's knowledge and understanding of their chosen artists and ability to develop an idea. The examination requires students to demonstrate their skills in developing an original idea from their own primary sources, inspired by the work of their chosen artist.

The examination format is differentiated by design through students being able to select their compositional section from the source material. Higher students will be encouraged to select more complex compositions and less confident students, simpler ones to enable all students to succeed.

b. Revision Material

Your development piece should show evidence of the following-

- 1) Response to your own good quality photographs
- 2) Skilful use of your chosen media, as appropriate to your subject matter and artist's work.
- 3) Imaginative and well-planned development work
- 4) Clear inspiration from the work of your chosen artist, already researched in sketchbook

c. Homework for May Half Term:

Title	Photoshoot relating to theme.
Description	Specific to students own chosen theme. Minimum of 35 high quality photographs
Length of Time to be Spent	60 minutes
Guidance of what to include	Covered within the lessons prior to May half term. Students will have discussed their photoshoot with teacher and planned resources/locations etc needed.
Completion Date	First lesson back after half term.

d. Standardisation & Mark Scheme

We will use the GCSE grading scheme for Art and Design that links to the AQA examination specification. We will standardise as a Dept team within 14 days of the assessment.

e. Generating an Overall Grade

Individual teachers will mark their group's assessments, which will then be standardised as a Dept as outlined above.
